The National Institution, later changed to National Institute, was established on May 15, 1840, by the adoption of a constitution and a declaration of its objects, which were to promote science and the useful arts, and to establish a national museum of natural history, etc. The founding of this society, as Dr. Goode explains, was doubtless to a very great degree due to the stimulating and inspiring effects upon public opinion of the Smithsonian bequest.
