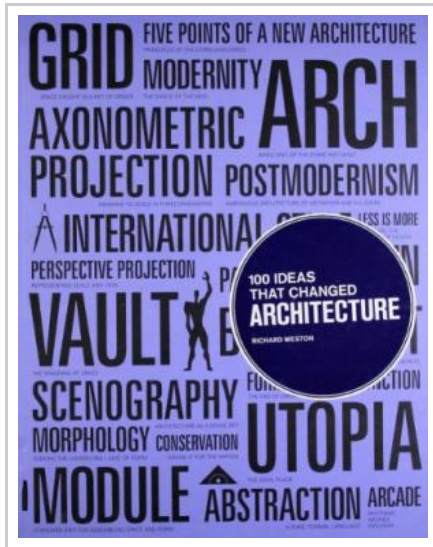




100 Ideas That Changed Architecture
